I used the rejection's disappointment as an opportunity to think about my aims and aspirations for the future. During this period of reflection, I came to understand my love of

teaching and made the decision to pursue a career in education. The Australian rejection was a turning point in my life. It forced me to re-evaluate my goals and consider different avenues that complemented my hobbies and strong points. I understood that becoming a teacher would enable me to pursue a rewarding career and have a beneficial influence on the lives of young students.

I decided to join a primary school Divine Buds Educational Academy located at Boudha-6 Kathmandu, Nepal. I started my teaching career as a primary teacher intern in 2018. Later I joined the organization as full-time assistant teacher. Currently, as a senior primary teacher, I provide leadership, mentorship to junior teachers, design curriculum, create inclusive classrooms, assess student progress, and engage in continuous professional development. I am very satisfied with my profession and job as everyone is happy. During these years of teaching, I have been constantly learning and gaining experience. I am always interested in encouraging my students and colleagues to explore new things. I can make sure that I will get involved as a volunteer in the available organization and use these experiences to support the community and continue my learning journey as well.

As his wife, it is important for me to be with him during this new chapter in our lives, as we support each other emotionally and physically in upcoming new environment and experiences during our stay in Canada. Moreover, our parents also have bank balance of CAD 91,980.40 in their bank account. My husband had completed his Bachelor of science in Environmental Management in 2022 from School of Environmental Science and Management, Pokhara University with outstanding grade and was Dean Listed 2022 and wanted to continue his educational journey in Canada as it is a country with best practical based education system. He always explains me that how he wants to introduce sustainability by encouraging youths, leading several projects working with Nepalese government.

I am Nepalese and married to a Nepalese citizen and have a residence permit which enables me to stay, work and own a property in Nepal. Also, we have no immediate relatives in Canada and all our loved ones are in Nepal which I can assure you that we will come back to our mother nation after the completion of my husband's studies. In addition to, my parents are the reason I will always return to Nepal. It is a blessing for everyone to spend time with their family. As the beloved daughter, my parents' love and care for me is unconditional. Another reason, I wish to work with a school who looks after differently abled children in Nepal that is looking for a long-term employee after my husband finishes his studies.
